General Information

Gaywood Primary School opened in September 2000 after an amalgamation between Rosebery Avenue First School and Gaywood Junior School, and caters for boys and girls, aged 4-11 years of age. At present, there are 415 children on roll. We have fourteen classrooms, a music mobile, a library, a hall with fixed apparatus, a carpeted hall. Gaywood Primary School is set in spacious grounds with two playgrounds and a large playing field.

In June 2017, Gaywood Primary joined the West Norfolk Academies Trust (WANT) comprising of seven primary schools and four high schools.



The West Norfolk Academies Trust is a small locally based charity working with Primary and Secondary schools in the West Norfolk area.

Our aim is to challenge and support a small group of schools to provide an excellent education for the young people of West Norfolk.

The Trust works in a supportive partnership with Primary and Secondary schools with each school maintaining their unique identity and ethos.

Admissions

By law children must start statutory education full time at the beginning of the term following their fifth birthday. The School's admission limit in our year groups is 60. Admissions to the school are handled by the Local Authority Admissions department.

In the event of over-subscription preference will be given to children living nearer to the school according to the following criteria, in order of priority:

- Children with a statement of Special Educational Needs naming the school,
- Children in public care who live in the area served by the school,
- Children who live within the catchment area and have a brother or sister attending the school at the time of their admission,
- Children who live outside the catchment area and have a brother or sister attending the school at the time of their admission.

In the event of over-subscription, children with special educational needs will not be refused admission or given lower priority than other applicants.



School Uniform

When the children join the school they are all expected to wear the school uniform. School uniform can be ordered and purchased from the school PTA throughout the school year.

- School jumper or cardigan
- White polo shirt or shirt
- Black or grey trousers, tailored shorts or pleated skirts



P.E. Uniform

- White round neck T-Shirt
- Plain navy/black shorts
- Indoor plimsolls (not trainers)
- Football/outdoor kit (7-11 years)
- Tracksuit may be worn for outdoor PE in cold weather
