



## Year 3 Homework Challenge – Summer 1<sup>st</sup> 2018

This term we have decided instead of setting a piece of challenge work weekly we will set a project each term based on our topic. This will run alongside the regular reading, spellings and maths that are set.

Our topic this term is '**Anglo Saxons**' and the following are all ideas that tie in with the topic:

<p><b><u>Create a poster</u></b> Draw and colour a picture of an Anglo-Saxon. What is he/she wearing? (You will need to research this first).</p>	<p><b><u>Model or Diagram</u></b> Create your own Sutton Hoo helmet/mask using whatever materials you have. You could use cardboard or paper Mache for example. You could also decorate it using tin foil or buttons. Look at the one found at Sutton Hoo for an example. (It can be any size).</p>	<p><b><u>Create a diary</u></b> You are an archaeologist who has dug up a box of Anglo Saxon artefacts. What could be inside? Describe in a diary entry, using adjectives and similes what you found.</p>
<p><b><u>Investigate!</u></b> Find out about a place called Sutton Hoo and what was discovered there. Get creative, you could film yourself presenting the information like a documentary and share with the rest of the class.</p>	<p>An activity of your choice!</p>  <p>Must be linked to our topic.</p>	<p><b><u>Recipe</u></b> Cook the Saxon recipe for shortbread with an adult. Record this task by writing the recipe out and taking photographs of the process and your finished product. The challenge work for Term 3 is due in **Monday 21<sup>st</sup> May** and during the week there will be time for each child to present their work and for it to be celebrated.

We will send home a book for this work, should your child wish to use, which will be called their '*Challenge book*'. It is completely up to the children to decide how they want to record it. They could use photos, diagrams, drawings or something else! All we ask is that everyone has a go, so they all have something to share at the end of each half-term.
