Activities to ensure Y6 can swim competently, confidently, and proficiently over a distance of 25 metres?	Y5 have a whole term swimming in the Spring term. Any children who cannot swim 25 metres get to go in the summer term.

Activities to ensure Y6 can use a range of strokes effectively (e.g. front crawl, backstroke, and breaststroke)?	Y5 have a whole term swimming in the Spring term where the range of strokes are assessed. Any children who cannot swim 25 metres get to go in the summer term.
Activities to ensure Y6 can perform safe self-rescue in different water-based situations?	All children have access to the two rescue sessions in Year 5 Spring and Summer term.

You can spend it on:

- **Raising staff confidence and skills** in PE through CPD, training or mentoring.
- **Hiring qualified sports coaches** to work with teachers, not replace them, so staff learn alongside.
- **Providing a wider range of extra-curricular activities** (e.g. new sports clubs, dance, outdoor activities).
- **Increasing participation in competitive sport**, such as covering transport costs to competitions.
- **Purchasing equipment and resources** that broaden the PE and sport on offer.
- **Improving physical activity across the school day**, such as playground markings, active break-time resources, or schemes that promote active travel.
- **Swimming top-ups**, if pupils are not meeting the statutory swimming and water safety requirements.
- **Engaging the least active children**, including targeted clubs or interventions.

You cannot spend it on:

- **Teachers' PPA cover** (it must not be used to release staff for non-PE related work).
- **Capital projects** (e.g. building a sports hall or resurfacing a playground).
- **Items that benefit only one cohort** (funding must create sustainable impact, not short-term fixes).
- **Elite sport provision** for a few talented pupils only.
- **Anything unrelated to sport/PE/physical activity** (e.g. classroom resources, ICT equipment).
