£4000	Developing teaching, planning and assessment.	Staff will work closely with the local School Sports Coordinator SSCO (specialist P.E. teacher) to develop a range of planning and assessment materials as well as developing their own subject knowledge and expertise. Here we can ensure high quality teaching and learning is sustainable and continually provided.	The quality of teaching and learning in PE will improve through high quality CPD.
£2000	Developing opportunities through clubs and promoting healthy lifestyles.	At Gaywood we use a local provider to help support us in delivering a broad range of clubs that will appeal to as many different pupils as possible. Our aim is to increase both the number of places available and the number of children taking up these places. This money will allow us to subsidise some clubs.	There will be an increase in the range of clubs available over the course of the year as well as an increase in participants from across the key stages.
